

ORDINANCE NO. 339

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH A METERED HANDICAPPED
PARKING SPACE ON-STREET IN THE
VILLAGE OF LOCH ARBOUR, COUNTY OF MONMOUTH

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Loch Arbour, in the County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to the authority granted to the Village of Loch Arbour by **N.J.S.A.** 39:4-197.6, the following location is hereby designated as a restricted parking space for use by any handicapped person to whom a windshield placard or wheelchair symbol license plates have been issued by the Division of Motor Vehicles.

Beginning at a point at the easternmost centerline of Euclid Avenue at the intersection of Ocean Place extending to a point 59.5 feet north thence continuing north for a distance of 13 feet, identified as Parking Meter Space #20.

Section 2. When any vehicle shall be parked in any space adjacent to which a parking meter is located in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance, the operator of said vehicle shall, upon entering the said parking space, immediately deposit or cause to be deposited a twenty-five cent coin of the United States in such parking meter and put such meter in operation, and failure to deposit such coin and put the meter in operation shall constitute a violation of this Ordinance and shall subject such person to the penalty prescribed hereinafter.

Section 3. Upon placing such meter in operation aforesaid, the parking space may be lawfully occupied by such vehicle for a period of thirty (30) consecutive minutes for each twenty-five cent coin of the United States deposited therein up to six hundred (600) minutes and payment of the aforesaid amounts for the above periods shall be made for parking in the areas set forth hereinabove. If any such vehicle shall remain parked in any parking space beyond the parking time limit as fixed by the coin or coins deposited in such meter for such parking space, the parking meter shall by its LCD enforcement signal indicate such illegal parking and in that event, such vehicle shall be considered parked overtime and beyond the period of legal parking time and shall constitute a violation of this Ordinance, and the owner or operator thereof shall be punished as hereinafter set out.

Section 4. It shall be unlawful and a violation of the provisions of this Ordinance to deposit or cause to be deposited in any parking meter, any slug, device or metallic substitute, or any other substitute for a twenty-five cent coin of the United States.

Section 5.

- a. Any person who parks displaying a windshield placard or wheelchair symbol license plates that have been issued by the Division of Motor Vehicles, who shall violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance, and any person who aids, abets or assists therein, shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine pursuant to statute.
- b. Any person who parks without displaying a windshield placard or wheelchair symbol license plates that have been issued by the Division of Motor Vehicles, who shall violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance, and any person who aids, abets or assists therein, shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine of \$250.00 and up to 90 days of community service, or both for the first offense pursuant to statute.
- c. In addition to any other penalty provided by New Jersey statute, any unoccupied vehicle parked or standing in violation of this Ordinance shall be deemed a nuisance and menace to the safe and proper regulation of traffic and any police officer may provide for the removal of such vehicle. The owner shall pay the reasonable costs of the removal and storage which may result from such removal before regaining possession of the vehicle.

Section 6.

- a. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances, which are inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistency.

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b. If any section, paragraph, subparagraph, clause or provision of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subparagraph, clause or provision so adjudged and remainder of this ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and publication as required by law.
